Meeting 13th July

The meeting was opened by the President, Sue Bourne, who thanked Lel Shaw for the beautiful flower arrangement for the President's table. She reported that the Garden Party in June had been a huge success and thanked the Committee for all their hard work. She also thanked members for their contributions to the tea, for running the stalls and for taking part in the fitness demonstration. John and Martin Barrow deserved a particular mention for their invaluable help behind the scenes. The President then announced that the WI stalls at the Nunton Fête had been less successful as there were fewer cakes than usual so the amount raised was disappointing.

Arrangements were discussed for the Wiltshire WI 90th Birthday Party at Hudson's Field and the summer outing to Blenheim Palace. Details of the next theatre group, skittles group, walking group and book group meetings were announced and Jean Van Hagen, the Secretary, read the correspondence. The Treasurer's report was followed by reports from members who had recently been to Denman College. Gill Dodd had used her bursary to attend a course on 'Buildings of Delight' and Peggy Knight, with four other members, had experienced 'Walking and Winding Down'. Both said that they had had an excellent time.

The Flower of the Month competition was won by Anne Waight with a spectacular lily. Members then listened to a most entertaining talk from Mr Norman Thorne, a local history expert, who took us through the history of the Fox family from Farley. He began with Stephen Fox, born in 1627, who rose to great power and wealth under Charles II. Amongst other things he was responsible for the building of many hospitals and alms houses, including Chelsea Hospital and the Farley alms houses. He continued to tell stories about further generations up to the 1800s. Pam Trubshaw thanked him for his well researched, fascinating talk about interesting people and their local connections.

The next meeting is on September 14th at the Radnor Hall when the speaker will be Group Captain Greenway talking about flying with the Royal Family. This meeting will be followed by an autumn lunch.

Summer Outing

On Wednesday, 15th July, 41 members went to Blenheim Palace for their summer outing.

Most members began their visit with a tour of the State Rooms of Vanbrugh's inspirational Palace before exploring the many other exhibitions and attractions on offer. Despite a grey start the weather improved so that members could enjoy 'Capability' Brown's landscaped parkland and the wonderful Formal Gardens.

There was something for everyone and the day went very quickly as there was so much to see and do.

Bells at Nunton Church

We have plans to do up the bells at Nunton Church which we believe will be well-received by local residents. These plans are;

- To restore the three present bells, two of which are listed as of historic interest, including special work to eliminate the risk of cracking in the bell crowns.
- To add a fourth bell. This will enable a far more musical peal or chime to be performed.
- To change the method of chiming from swing to stationary. There is not enough space to add a fourth swinging bell, and this new method in any case has an advantage in enabling one person, even a child, to chime all four bells easily.
- To add a new floor just below the bell-frame for safer and easier maintenance and for better sound distribution.

For further information, please contact Harry Joynt who is co-ordinating the project.

As to funding, we have a local donor for the additional fourth bell and we intend to apply for grants from several charities which support the restoration of old bells. In some cases part of the grant award process involves us in consulting with the local community to ascertain the level of interest and support.

This is not asking for money. We are simply seeking views from as many people as possible in the parish, whether they are churchgoers or not. Denis Blake stepped in to give some brief, but interesting, facts and figures about the restoration work.


