## Landfill Grant for Nunton Church

A grant of nearly £8,800 towards various improvements at St Andrew's Church Nunton is being obtained from the Landfill Communities Fund, made possible by a handsome "Third Party Contribution" from Lord Radnor and the Longford Estate. With other grants and special funding for a fourth bell coming to £7,900, an old legacy of £4,300, and local donations including a couple of concerts amounting to £6,000, we expect to reach £27,000. Local donations will be spent on new carpets, chairs for when needed in the south aisle, and on the bells. If our last outstanding grant application for £3,000 is successful, we could replace our old and thirsty central heating boiler.

The bells will be taken out mid August and returned towards the end of the year fully refurbished for reinstallation with an additional fourth bell. Reordering of some of the church interior – pews, asbestos removal, central heating – will start on 2<sup>nd</sup> August and take up to three weeks to complete. Church redecoration will take place in the autumn and then new carpets will replace the present mats. Other works in August/September are to update the Barker Room electrics, some tree surgery to the churchyard yews and a French drain to tackle a chronic damp problem in the Lady Chapel.

Many thanks to all those who have responded to our appeal. If there is anybody else out there who would like to contribute, please get in touch with one of us.

More news as works progress.


