Sue said that in future four Hostesses will be required to help organise each meeting, rather than three; also we will be appointing a new Committee Member at the AGM in March and Sue asked for volunteers.

Jean van Hagen gave the Secretary's report with details of future events including a trip to South Wales, a visit to Kew Gardens and Kew Palace, a Pancake Day Feast and a Compost Workshop! Variety is truly the spice of life for WI members! Sheila May gave the Treasurer's report and reminded everyone that subscriptions are due by the end of January. Julia Joynt won the flower of the month competition with a brave little early Iris "Catherine Hodgkin". The Denman Draw selected two bursary winners, Jean Martin and Barbara Bradford; names of reserves were also drawn in case of need. The bursaries entitle the winners to attend courses of their choice at Denman College. Also, there is a trip to an Open Day at Denman College on 24 September twenty places will be booked for members. Travel will be by car.

After coffee Dr Philippa Swayne gave a talk entitled "Anaesthesia in a Developing Country" about a trip in 2007 to Azad Kashmir, situated between Indian Kashmir and Pakistan. On this visit the specialist team performed anaesthesia and surgery on one hundred and eight children with serious facial deformities, such as cleft palates, which are very common genetic defects in that area. Conditions were primitive and required amazing skill, initiative and endurance from the team. This was Dr Swayne's third talk to our WI and we were, again, filled with admiration for this dedicated team of experts. The work is funded by charitable donations, mainly from the Pakistani community in UK. Julia Joynt thanked her most sincerely on behalf of everyone and reassured her that her talks are so fascinating that she is always welcome.

The next meeting is on February 11, speaker Mrs Marion Emery. There will be a "Bring and Buy a Book" stall. Any books not sold can be reclaimed by their donors or will be given to the bookstall in aid of the hospital Stars Appeal.

London Marathon

After 6 years of being rejected, I qualified for an automatic place in the 2008 London Marathon. This will be my 12th London Marathon and feels special to me as I've had to wait quite a while for this one!

I would like to raise funds jointly for two causes this year chosen by my friend who herself has had breast cancer. The first is Breakthrough Breast Cancer, as so many of us know people affected by this disease who could benefit from the research this charity undertakes.

The second is Marlborough House which is an adolescent mental health unit taking youngsters from around Wiltshire who have a range of emotional, psychological and psychiatric difficulties. These specialist hospital units are few and far between, but provide an invaluable service for the teenagers in their care. They use donations to provide music and sports equipment, for example, to help with their therapy and ease the difficulties of being away from home for often long periods. As I know a young lad who is currently staying at the Unit with post traumatic related difficulties, I would like to give half the money raised this year to the Unit which is of such benefit to him and his family.

If you feel able to sponsor me, or could take a sponsor form to help me get sponsors, I would be very grateful. If any business is interested in making a donation, (obviously highest bidder wins!) I would be prepared to wear a running vest with the company logo as a means of publicising their support.


Chalke Valley Flower Club

Being a School Governor

How do Governors help Schools and Children?

School Governors are people who wish to make a contribution to children's education. Governors are volunteers who spend about 6 hours per term attending meetings and working to further the school's development.

Will I receive training?

Governors receive a nationally designed induction programme about their roles and responsibilities. Free training is offered by the local authority for a range of areas of governance.

What do Governors do?

Together with the Head Teacher they set the direction for the school and decide how the school's budget will be spent. Governing bodies make decisions collectively on matters such as performance management, school policies and the school development plan.
