Many readers will already know that Angela Moules, a long time resident of Bodenham and Odstock, died on Christmas Day 2008. We do not usually have obituaries on our front page but Angela deserves a special place here for all the work she did for News and Notes. As far as I can establish, Angela edited News and Notes for about 17 years, before my predecessor Clare Penny took over, and, I believe, it was Angela who was the founding editor of N&N in its current form starting with edition No. 1 in May 1976.

I've had an opportunity to look back at quite a number of the issues of N&N produced during Angela's editorial reign and her wide-ranging interests, not least in local activities, are very evident. Indeed, at her funeral, the eulogy delivered by Gill Smedley began with the words "Angela was quite a character! Most of us will have particular memories of her. Maybe we enjoyed her letters, her cooking, her painted cards or photos, for she had so many talents. She had lots of stories and her interests were wide. Her life touched many and she had lots of friends."

Later in that eulogy, we heard that "Angela adored quizzes and crosswords, often spending days hunting for answers to a fiendish clue, and persuading others to rack their brains. Then of course there were the notorious nude WI Calendar girls - Angela was most keen to take part, which she did with a characteristic twinkle in her eye! She certainly wasn't shy!" Clearly all these attributes contributed to her

St Andrew's, Nunton

Margaret Morgan and Adrian Taylor Churchwardens, St Andrews, Nunton

In our PCC meetings, we have been considering ways in which we might enhance the facilities provided by St Andrew's, Nunton. We are conscious that the church is very attractive, both inside and out, and we do not want to embark on anything that does not, at least, maintain its current appeal. Nor do we wish to make changes without having general support from the wider community.

Our motive in seeking change springs from a number of aims. First, we would like to improve wheelchair access. At present, it is very awkward to bring wheelchairs into church and then position them suitably for a service. Next, we would like to have an area within the church where people sometimes could gather after a service, perhaps with coffee or even a glass of wine. Those who came to the splendid Harvest Thanksgiving service this year will recognise that we would have been well served by a clear area where we could have stood and talked to each other. Then, we would like to have some space for a table to display books and other materials connected with our faith and the life of the church.

Having considered various possibilities and, taking account of practical considerations, we have concluded that the most effective way of achieving our aims is by the removal of the pews in the south aisle. These are the pews to the far right, as you stand in the main aisle looking towards the altar. This would mean removing both the pews and the platform they stand on and repositioning the central heating pipes which currently run under and through the pews. We would replace the floor, probably with wood to match other areas of the church, although we would also consider the possibility of a stone floor.

For the vast majority of services, the pews in the main body of the church would be sufficient to seat the congregation even when we achieve another of our aims which is to increase the numbers worshipping! However, we would also plan to acquire some suitable attractive chairs, which could be put in the south aisle when more seats were needed and then stacked neatly away when not required.

In addition to achieving our primary aims, we feel that the interior of the church would be enhanced aesthetically by the creation of some open space and we are aware that other churches have made similar changes to very good effect.

Needless to say, the proposed changes would come at some cost. Our intention is to address this aspect when and if we are satisfied that the plans are generally welcomed.

We would welcome any questions and comments on our proposals and would be happy to arrange to meet people at the church to explain our ideas further "on location".

CHIP AND FAT PAN FIRES IN THE HOME

Melanie Jezzard - Community Safety Advisor

When householders are confronted by a chip or fat pan fire in the home they should GET OUT, STAY OUT AND CALL THE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE.

Historically, the advice given by Government and the Fire and Rescue Service to those confronted by a chip or fat pan fire in the home was to tackle and extinguish the fire themselves. The method advised was to run a tea cloth under a tap, wring it out and then place the damp tea cloth over the rim of the pan.

This issue has been debated at the CFOA National Fire Prevention Committee. Although it was recognised that some people will continue to tackle chip and fat pan fires in the home, it was felt, on balance, that the best advice should be to 'get out, stay out and call 999'. This would allow a trained firefighter, in appropriate protective clothing, to extinguish the fire more safely.

The advice now given is:

- Don't take any risks. Turn off the heat if it's safe to do so. Never throw water over it.
- Don't tackle the fire yourself.
- GET OUT STAY OUT AND CALL 999


