Coping with disruptions or disasters

Yes, the snow was very beautiful! Until my boiler went! Jolly cold it was then, smelly too from an oil leak, and my mood and countenance were suddenly less than pretty! It doesn't take much to throw us, does it? Schools shut, transport cancelled and a massive disruption to our daily life.

And then came news of the devastating earthquake in Haiti and our minds can hardly take in the horror of it. Not just disruption to everyday life, but the total collapse of everything – buildings, roads, hospitals, communications and transport infrastructure. Already one of the poorest countries in the world, Haiti is now crushed.

Emotionally, we feel numb. I met someone in the village, who said "As soon as I heard the news, I just knew I *had to do* something, so I went straight on line to make a donation" Spiritually, we all flounder – where is God in all this? Some people feel angry. How can I worship a loving God? Why do such bad things happen to such poor people? It's so unfair! There are no easy answers. When disasters happen, it is best to say little, but to pray. But – amazingly - pictures from Haiti showed Christians outside their ruined churches, singing and praising God in a way that we might never imagine! They who have so little, still have God. Maybe - just maybe? - part of our problem in dealing with disaster, is our total dependence not on God, but on other things which may prove less secure in the end. I say this, not to judge, but because I feel utterly helpless, and so utterly driven to pray.....

Sarum Orchestra

"The Odstock Curse"

Salisbury Arts Centre on Saturday 6th March

When Sarum Orchestra asked their clarinettist Sarah Homer (formerly Bilbao Symphony Orchestra and 80s band "Loose Tubes"; currently Django Bates' band "Delightful Precipice" and Musical Director - Globe Theatre) to compose a piece for them, she chose to base it on the early 19th century local legend "The Odstock Curse" with its gypsies, the hanging of the innocent Joshua Scamp and the curse by the Gipsy Queen on anyone who locked the church door.

Sarah's piece tells the story through instrumentals, songs and dances performed by a fantastic line-up of musicians including percussionist Martin France (Professor of Drums - Royal Academy of Music), bass player Tim Harries ("Steeleye Span"; currently playing with Katie Melua, Brian Eno, Mike Westbrook among others), Sarah herself as the Gypsy Queen and a group of her fellow Sarum Orchestra players.

The Family Concert (3.00pm) is a great opportunity for children to be part of an afternoon of music making with some of the most brilliant musicians of today – listening, playing and singing along. Based on themes from *The Odstock Curse*, the afternoon is led by Howard Moody with his huge experience of bringing music alive for children. It will be a very exciting hour! Tickets: £5

The Evening Concert (7.30pm) brings the first full performance of *The Odstock Curse*. The concert opens with Shostakovich's deeply personal *Piano Quintet in G minor* played by Howard Moody and string quartet. Written in 1940, this work is a testimony to life under another curse - the curse of terror – albeit music full of beauty, serenity and humour. Tickets: £15.50; under 25s £5

A338 and Bus Service

Last month I mentioned the road surfacing programme on the A338 southwards from Downton to the Hampshire boundary. Originally work was scheduled to start on 11th January but this has been postponed as a result of the bad weather and local opposition to the complete road closure which was being planned.

After a number of meetings with all concerned, the work on the section of the A338 between the Batten Road roundabout and the traffic lights with The Borough will start on 25th January and last 3 weeks, using temporary traffic signals during the day.

Work on the section of the A338 from The Borough southwards will be carried out at night between 7.00pm and 6.00am during late February and early March. Temporary traffic lights will be operating whilst work is in progress but the road will be clear during daylight hours. This should avoid the risk of traffic diverting onto the minor roads in the Forest.

Users of the local Pulseline bus may be aware that this service is being withdrawn by Wilts & Dorset. Mid February was the original date but this has now been put back until 21st March.

Needless to say there was a great deal of resistance to the withdrawal of our local bus but a new service No 44 will now replace it. This service will run at one and a half hour intervals against Pulseline's hourly service, but at least this is better than having no public transport connecting the villages with the hospital and city centre. I have seen the draft timetable but will give details next month when timings are finalised.

Waste Disposal

Wiltshire Council Press Release

Your chance to have your say

Wiltshire Council is now responsible for collecting and disposing of household rubbish. Before the unitary council came into being on 1st April 2009, rubbish was collected by the four former district councils and the then county council disposed of it.

The move from five councils to one means the service is different across Wiltshire and needs to be standardised to ensure everyone has the same efficient, high quality service.

The council is facing tough recycling targets and the cost of landfill is due to double. Currently landfill costs are between £40 and £72 per ton -£4.4 million. This will go up to £8 million in three years. The amount going to landfill has been reduced 90,000 tons each year. A 40 per cent recycling rate has been achieved and the target is 45% recycling by 2015 and 50% by 2020. Currently, the differing services, their costs and recycling rates are:

North - Household rubbish collected weekly, recycling fortnightly and fortnightly garden waste (charged) - average collection and disposal cost per property is £117.25. Recycling rate is 28%.

South - Household rubbish collected weekly, recycling (including plastic and cardboard)fortnightly and fortnightly garden waste (charged) - average collection and disposal cost per property is £136.06. Recycling rate is 35%.

East - Household rubbish collected fortnightly, recycling fortnightly and fortnightly garden waste (charged) - average collection and disposal cost per household is £97.97. Recycling rate is 45%.

West - Household rubbish collected fortnightly, recycling fortnightly and fortnightly garden waste (not charged) - average collection and disposal cost per household is £115.51. Recycling rate is 45%.

The council wants to ensure everyone has the chance to comment on the proposals and to know the full facts and figures. All the options and costs are being publicised and people asked to let us know their preferred option. The consultation starts at the end of January and runs until the end of April.

It includes:

- Displays at area board meetings from 2nd February to April.
- Roadshows in Chippenham, Trowbridge, Devizes and Salisbury – dates tbc.
- Feedback through Your Wiltshire magazine.
- Online at www.recycleforwiltshire.com

 Questionnaires at area board meetings, in libraries and council offices.

The options are:

- 1: Household rubbish collected one week, recycling the next + garden waste charges
- Annual average cost per household £123 (collection and disposal)
- Expect to recycle 43%
- 2: Household rubbish collected one week, recycling the next + fortnightly collection of plastic bottles and cardboard + garden waste charges
- Annual average cost per household £131 (collection and disposal)
- Expect to recycle 44%
- 3: Household rubbish collected one week, recycling the next + fortnightly collection of plastic bottles and cardboard + weekly collection of food waste + garden waste charges
- Annual average cost per household £148 (collection and disposal)
- Expect to recycle 54%

St. Martins, the 13th century parish church of Fifield Bavant and the second smallest in England in regular use, is positioned in the centre of the Chalke Valley between Broadchalke and Ebbesbourne Wake. The church is much loved by locals and visitors alike and is in desperate need of restoration. The appeal target has been set at £75,000.

An open meeting will take place in the church on Wednesday March 10th at 6.30pm when all will be welcome to have a say or put forward a point of view. There will be regular announcements in the local press with details of fund raising events, and progress reports.
