Sue Bourne welcomed everybody, and gave us the news that Mrs Lovesey, a founder member, had died at the grand old age of 97. Anne Waight was thanked for her unusual and Christmassy flower arrangement.

The business meeting was conducted rapidly as other things like bring and buy, bookstall and raffle beckoned, as did the mulled wine, sausage rolls and mince pies. Our finances are healthy, partly due to the generosity of the Fête Committee who gave a handsome cheque (which goes towards the two bursaries to Denman College), in spite of the fact that we had not done so well on our three stalls at the Fête this year.

We then broke for coffee and some chatter and spent some money on the well stocked stalls.

After the break we were entertained with a carol selection, and made to sing for our supper, by the Ashburton Handbell Ringers. They gave a brief history of handbell ringing which has been practised in this country for many centuries and reached its height in Victorian times when ambitious concerts were given, playing selections from operetta, oratorio as well as popular songs of the time. After the First World War the art almost disappeared until a society was formed in the late 1960s. The Ashburton Handbell Ringers have upgraded to a three octave set of Malmark Handbells with the money donated by the National Lottery. The sound is both bright and mellow and very easy to listen to. They were thanked by Sue Amey.

Britford Parish Council met on Wednesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2009 when the following subjects were discussed.:

- The streetlamp on the High Road should be replaced after 7th December 2009.
- From the Environmental Agency's meeting on Flood Control, the parish need to check on the availability of sandbags. Will residents please tell parish councillors or the clerk about gulleys etc. that are becoming blocked.
- The Parish precept was set for next year, the same as last year at £550.

- Notices re the changes to Britford and Odstock schools are on display at Britford Bridge Farm shop, Lower Road notice board, and the gate at Britford Primary school until Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> January 2010.
- A meeting is to be organised between Parish Councillors and staff at Wiltshire Council at Wilton to discuss ways of solving the large puddle in the Britford Park and Ride area on the A338.

The next Council meeting is on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2010.

Good news. The recent consultation asking for views on the proposed amalgamation of our two local schools has been positive. 95% of respondents were in favour of the amalgamation.

As you may have seen in the press Public Notices have now been issued and it is anticipated that, once responses to the notices have been received, if all goes to plan the schools will be joining together from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2010.

The closure of Odstock Primary School on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2009 is a technicality. Education will continue on both sites under a new name from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2010.

Once the amalgamation is formally signed, some time in February 2010, the Governors will be consulting the local community about many important matters over the amalgamated school – have you thought about a name for the newly formed school? Have you any ideas for school uniform? You will hear further from the Governors later this winter as we want you to be involved in the decisions.

#### **Radnor Hall News**

As of interest we reproduce a recent news item in the Salisbury Journal:

#### "Hall's lottery boost

THE Radnor Hall in Bodenham has been given £1,000 of lottery funding towards a new stage.

It means the hall committee has been able to order the £8,000 moveable stage, which should arrive in January.

The rest of the money came from a grant from the old Salisbury District Council, other charitable sources, car boot sales and a Christmas show.

Treasurer Brian Clake said: "We often put on shows, and hire the hall out for discos and other events. This new stage comes apart in sections and will be much more easily usable." Lottery money also helped fund the hall's £50,000 extension, which opened in September last year, providing facilities for disabled people and a storage area. And it met

half the £8,600 cost of a grassed picnic and

play area, completed in April. "

As of further interest, over the last ten years we have raised a total £109,000 of which £36,000 through our own efforts - car boot sales, pantos, revues, Fête and other donations - £40,000 from the Lottery, £12,000 from Landfill and £21,000 from County, District and other grant sources. These funds have financed the Hall extension and, earlier on, the kitchen, furniture, lights and other improvements including the parking and grassed areas outside.

The Hall, of course, is now a great deal more used and this year we should be covering our increased operating costs without recourse to fund raising. The hire charging structure has recently been revised and simplified, with Britford and Charlton residents added as local users entitled to reduced rates.

The only further improvements that we have in mind at present are optional or cosmetic such as surface improvements to the driveway and parking areas, new curtains, repositioning of stage lights. If anybody has any ideas for new uses of the hall please contact any member of the management committee.

#### **A338 Roadworks**

Last month I reported on the major road resurfacing programme on the A338 from Downton to the Hampshire boundary due to start on 18<sup>th</sup> January and lasting 4 months.

Since then there have been some changes to the schedule. The work will now start on 11<sup>th</sup> January and initially under temporary traffic signals from the Batten Road roundabout in Downton to the traffic lights at the junction with The Borough.

From Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> January there will be a complete road closure from the junction with The Borough southwards to the County boundary. This closure will last for 6 weeks whilst major reconstruction of this section of the carriageway takes place. Diversion signs will be in place with through traffic routed via the A36, M27 and A31. It is envisaged local traffic will use the local road network.

Whilst the overall timetable has been reduced from upwards of 20 weeks down to 9 weeks, clearly such a prolonged road closure will impact heavily on our local minor roads and on the bus schedules during the winter period. Discussions are still taking place with the Highways Department to see if there are ways of alleviating such major disruption but these are the latest plans.






