Few of us live in homes with such luxuries, let alone have second homes against which to claim expenses, so most of us feel little sympathy. We expect better of our leaders.

Politicians may have been working within the rules (just!) but certainly not in the spirit of honest decency, let alone real integrity. I have a book on my shelf on Christian leadership called "Integrity – Leading with God watching". God watches our every move, but as the Bible makes plain, he also sees into our hearts, the desires and thoughts behind our actions. To imagine God watching my every move, let alone looking into my heart, certainly makes me stop and think!

The heart is the place of our affections and priorities. "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" said Jesus, who knew that money can so easily come first. We can't live without money, but money can, if we are not careful, rule our life. We tend to want more than we have; we think more money will make life easier or better. So greed is the most subtle of temptations, always ready to lead us astray. St Paul put it so well: "The *love* of money is a root of all kinds of evil".

My prayer is that we can learn to replace Greed with two other words beginning with G – Gratitude (to God) and Generosity (to others). Signs of real integrity. Alison Williams



St Mary's Church, Odstock News and History



St Mary's Church. Odstock is about 800 years old, and parts of the present Church survive from an earlier Norman Church which once stood on the site. The earliest recorded vicar served in 1232, a memorial stone in the church dates from about 1320, the tenor bell was cast circa 1400 and the other bells cast circa 1601 and the Elizabethan pulpit is dated 1570. We understand from the bell experts that all three bells were cast in the church yard. Whatever its history, it represents continuity in the community life of Odstock and has seen the baptisms, weddings and funerals of the inhabitants of this village for almost as long as there has been a village.

Therefore, news of its impending closure in 1995 gave quite a shock to the congregation, as the roof was in a poor state of repair and no funds were to be made available from the Parochial Church Council. The Redundant Churches organisation would not take over the responsibility for the Church at that time, so it was up to locals to support the church repairs or lose this amenity.

A few dedicated local people got together and decided that the dereliction of the church was an unacceptable scenario and so a Registered Charity was set up in 1995 solely to fund the repairs and restoration of Odstock Church. As the full Charity name is too long for most people to fit on the payee space on a cheque, banking for the charity goes under the name of Odstock Church Appeal Fund, which is more memorable and does fit on a cheque quite easily!

With great effort and determination given the urgency of the situation, over a short period of a few years enough money was raised to have the roof refurbished at a considerable cost of £35,000.

The Fund continued fundraising by standing orders, Flower Festival, car boots, selling teas and cakes and other ad hoc events and donations. Plate donations from some collections at christenings, weddings and funerals are donated directly to the Odstock Church Appeal Fund. Service collections all go to the PCC and none of this is used to fund Odstock Church repairs. There are specific forms for donations to the Odstock Church Appeal Fund at the Church entrance.

By 2005 sufficient funds had been raised to have the organ refurbished at a cost of £7,800. Richard Seal the Church organist was a great help in advising and overseeing the refurbishment.

In addition to works paid for solely by the Fund, many locals have aided recent Church improvements;

- Lord Radnor donated the land for the Church car park and Peter Martin paid for the materials and laying of the parking surface.
- Eric Grant, a previous inhabitant of the village, hand-made the entrance gates with materials supplied by the Fund.
- Rita Hobbs refurbished the Altar cloths and made curtains with materials supplied by the Fund.

Last year heavy winds blew the two crosses off the roof and broke them, but fortunately their replacement was covered by insurance. Have you noticed they look really lovely?

Then, most recently, with the help of some generous benefactors and funds raised from a summer concert at the Church, we were able to reach our target and have the Church internally redecorated and repaired at a cost of £22,000. So now the Church looks the best that it has for a long time.

We are now very low on funds but will continue to keep fundraising as the next restoration project will be the repairs to frames and bells, including turning of the ancient bells.
