The Big Battlefield Bike Ride

"I, too, saw God through mud" (Wilfred Owen, not me!)

Sheri Start and I have just returned from cycling through the battlefields of Northern France in aid of Help for Heroes. Between us we have raised over £7000 and are still counting. This is rewarding, makes us feel proud of our achievement and is very much down to the fantastic support of the local community. A sincere thank you from us both to everyone.

Many of you will have visited the Memorials. Here are a few impressions out of the many that affected us

during the ride. It was a challenge, as much for our emotions as our bottoms.

The ages on the gravestones; thousands and thousands of teenage boys and young men wiped out day after day.

The row upon row of gravestones with the inscription "Unknown soldier of the Great War. Known unto God". For me this offers reassurance that, rather than being an anonymous number; just one of thousands, each and every one of them is intimate with his God.

Sheri was a great companion. Her thoughtful words often provoked my weary brain to click into gear - it took me all my powers of concentration to cope with the bike's gears. On the second day, as we pedalled (struggled actually) up long hills in cold rain, we saw a small cemetery ahead. It wasn't a planned stop and we debated whether we should just crack on. Sheri announced we should stop for a moment saying, "I am just going to make time to connect with one person in that cemetery ".

We weren't deep and meaningful all the time. By the third day the sun was shining and we were cruising along as we followed the line of the Western Front to Ypres. Another good one from Sheri, "I am really sorry that they all had to die, but I am grateful they did it in a flat place."

The tunnels at Arras were horrific. This was where Wilfred Owen lost his life. His words "I am the enemy you killed my friend" set me thinking and I asked the guide who accompanied us where all the young German dead were buried. It was so obvious that the womenfolk of Germany were also losing their sons, husbands, brothers, friends.......

After a couple of flat days in Flanders, we were in need of a hill. Our final steep ascent was up a bumpy cobbled road to the hill top town of Cassell, from where the view to our destination of Dunkirk was magnificent. The Grand Old Duke of York marched his troops up this hill in 1793. Unlike his poor men, we were rewarded at the top with yet more chocolate "energy" bars and Lucozade.

The padre, who cycled with us and conducted our ceremonies, encouraged us to have a sense of gratitude at all times. Seeing wounded servicemen cycling alongside us using their arms to pedal, inspired us not to complain about aching legs at the end of the day; rather to just be grateful for them.

In 2008, Bryn Parry wrote "the dead we shall remember, the wounded we must look after ". Help for Heroes has captured the public's imagination and has raised millions to help rehabilitate service personnel. Sheri and I feel privileged to have been able to make our contribution. Thank you again.

Suggested recipe for Cake Competition

(See page with Fête details)

Classic Victoria Jam Sponge Cake - recipe from Delia Smith:

4 oz / 110 g butter 4 oz caster sugar 4 oz / 110 g SR flour 2 large eggs (beaten) Few drops vanilla essence Little hot water if required. To finish – Jam and sifted icing sugar.

Oven: Gas 3 / Electricity 170 C

2 x 7 inch cake tins, greased and lined with parchment / greaseproof paper.

Method: Cream the butter and sugar till pale and fluffy. Add the beaten eggs, a little at a time, beating well between each addition. Stir in a few drops of vanilla essence. Use a metal spoon to fold in the flour, a little at a time. If the consistency is too thick, add a little hot water. Divide mixture between the two tins. Bake 25 – 30 minutes. Cool, then sandwich with jam.

Downton NPT Priorities

The local Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) priorities for the current period were decided at a recent meeting of our Neighbourhood Tasking Group (NTG) and some of those are set out below.

Please attend one of our surgeries or email us to have your say on the priorities.

Speeding - across all parishes

We continue to carry out regular speed enforcement checks and are actively promoting our Community Speed Watch (CSW) scheme.

We are still looking for CSW volunteers; please let us know if you are interested in starting a CSW scheme in your area.

Foot Patrols by local officers

Local officers will carry out regular foot patrols to improve the visibility of local policing and provide reassurance to residents.

In larger villages (Downton/ Redlynch) our foot patrols will target areas prone to ASB.

In smaller villages, officers will utilise busier times/ locations such as schools and local shops in order to meet and consult with local people.

Burglary Crime Prevention Advice

With the warmer weather here it's important that you follow the advice set out below:

- Close and lock windows/doors when you are not in the room, especially when leaving the house or in the garden.
- Double check that doors and windows are locked at night.
- Keep valuable items out of view and reach of windows and doors.
- If you see anyone acting suspiciously take their description and details of any vehicle registration, including direction of travel and call the police on 0845 408 7000 or 999 if they are about to break into a property,
- Stolen property can now be returned to the owner using a system called immobilise visit www.immobilise.com details.

<u>Distraction Burglars and Bogus Callers Crime</u> Prevention Advice

Follow the SOS – STAY OUT STRANGER advice when you get a caller at the door. Keep your door shut and locked and use a spy hole or window. Do NOT open the door if you do not recognise or are not expecting a caller. Avoid keeping large amounts of cash at home.

Would you like to become a rainfall observer?

The Environment Agency and the Met Office have around 50 voluntary rainfall observers across South Wessex which read the rainfall every day. This data is of great value and helps with our understanding of rainfall patterns across the UK. We are currently looking for a rainfall observer in your area.

If you are interested in becoming a voluntary rainfall observer, all equipment provided, please ask yourself the following questions:

Are you able to read a rain gauge every morning at 9am GMT? - Late readings or missed days are acceptable, as long as these details are clearly recorded.

Do you have a spacious garden? - It is important that the gauge is not over sheltered. Objects will need to be roughly twice as far away from the gauge as they are high. For example a 4 meter high tree will need to be 8 meters away from the rain gauge location.


