He gave us eyes to see them....

'All things bright and beautiful' is a much loved hymn. The final verse reminds us:
*He gave us eyes to see them, and lips that we might tell
how great is God almighty who has made all things well.*

Of course, if we have eyes and ears, it doesn't always mean that we will notice beautiful things around us. Sometimes, we are too absorbed in our own concerns. How often have I totally failed to notice a newly open flower in the garden as I dash in and out of the house! How often do I miss some lovely bird-song outside, because I am busy at my computer! As the poem says : What is life if, full of care, we have no time to stand and stare' Beauty may be there – but do we notice?

The American newspaper the Washington Post proved this back in January 2007. In the early morning rush-hour, in the metro subway station, a young violinist began to play. He was good. He played difficult pieces by Bach. A hidden camera filmed him. In 45 minutes, 1079 people walked by. Only 7 people stopped. A few others threw coins into the violin case on the ground. After each piece, no one applauded. When the violinist stopped and counted his money, it was just 32 dollars and 17 cents.

But what people didn't realise - this was Joshua Bell, a world famous classical violinist. The Stradivarius violin he played was worth 3.5 million dollars. Two nights before he had played at a sell-out concert, where the average price for seats was 100 dollars. People simply didn't expect such lovely music, at an unexpected time and place on their way to work. They had failed to recognise genius. They had missed a real gift!

Jesus talked of the flowers of the fields being even more beautiful than all Solomon's splendour. As summer comes, let's have eyes and ears open to appreciate God's beautiful world!

Classic Victoria Jam Sponge Cake - recipe from Delia Smith :

4 oz / 110 g butter

4 oz caster sugar

4 oz / 110 g SR flour

2 large eggs (beaten)

Few drops vanilla essence

Little hot water if required.

To finish – Jam and sifted icing sugar.

Oven : Gas 3 / Electricity 170 C

2 x 7 inch cake tins, greased and lined with parchment / greaseproof paper.

Method: Cream the butter and sugar till pale and fluffy. Add the beaten eggs, a little at a time, beating well between each addition. Stir in a few drops of vanilla essence. Use a metal spoon to fold in the flour, a little at a time. If the consistency is too thick, add a little hot water. Divide mixture between the two tins. Bake 25 – 30 minutes. Cool, then sandwich with jam.

Downton NPT Priorities

One of the local Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) priorities for the current period is Speeding - see details below.

The priorities will be reviewed this month through our Neighbourhood Tasking Group (NTG). Please attend one of our surgeries to have your say on the priorities.

Speeding - across all parishes

Local officers continue to carry out regular speed enforcement checks and are actively promoting the extension of our Community Speed Watch (CSW) scheme.

Our Woodfalls CSW scheme will shortly be resuming their checks on the Ridge and our newly formed Homington CSW should be active towards the end of this month.

We are still looking for CSW volunteers so please let us know if you are interested in starting a CSW scheme in your area.

Police Surgeries

In line with the Policing Pledge an officer from Downton NPT will be available to discuss any of your concerns at the following events:

We will also hold regular surgeries in *Downton* as soon as our Library Police Office is opened.

Credit Card Advice

We are warning the public and businesses to be extra vigilant after a recent spate of credit card fraud in the county. Over recent weeks, the offenders have been applying for credit cards in their own names, but upon receiving the cards have replaced the magnetic strip on the back with the details of cards that have previously been stolen.

As the credit cards have been tampered with they are rejected by chip and pin machines and the offenders are asked to sign for the goods that they are purchasing. However, instead of charging the goods to the offenders' accounts, they are charged to the people who have had their credit cards stolen, as it is their information on the backs of the cards.

In particular businesses should be looking out for cards that are rejected by chip and pin machines and sales assistants should be checking the numbers on the front of credit cards and making sure that they correspond with the numbers printed on the receipt. If they differ then the cards have been tampered with.

Members of the public should also not give thieves the opportunity to steal their cards. Do this by carrying valuable items in a zip up bag so that they are not on display, never writing down pin numbers, or at the very least not keeping a pin number with a bank card.

If anyone comes across one of these cards or has any information regarding these incidents they should contact Police immediately.

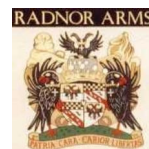
