Local Priorities

At our recent Neighbourhood Tasking Group meeting (NTG includes representatives from all Parishes across Downton NPT) the local priorities for the coming 3 month period were decided as-

1- Anti-Social Behaviour in Moot Lane area of Downton.

2- Speeding at designated locations across all Parishes

3- High profile enforcement of HGV weight restriction – Downton/ Redlynch (following completion of bridgeworks)

The enforcement of the weight restriction is a new priority and has been put in place in response to concerns from local residents.

Local crime report

There have also been 11 reported crimes at Salisbury District Hospital within this period.

These crimes are listed for information as to local crime patterns but our overall crime figures show that crime is down nearly 20% when compared with last year.

Become a School Governor at Britford Primary School


