#### Message from Empangeni

Sherwood and Stephanie Elcock

As many of you will know at the end of last summer we abandoned the NHS to take up work in a public hospital in South Africa in a town not dissimilar in size to Salisbury, but our workload is somewhat different.

In theatre, Steph sees a large amount of trauma, resulting from either inter-personal violence or accidents which takes up the majority of operating theatre time. It is not unusual for the hospital to treat several gunshot or stab wounds in a single day. There is no spare capacity for non-urgent elective work such as hip replacement surgery. In Family Medicine my work is dominated by managing patients suffering from the twin epidemics of HIV/AIDS and TB.

The Family Medicine department is newly built, air-conditioned and would be a pleasure to work in where it not hopelessly overcrowded most of the time. There are plenty of locally trained nurses but nowhere near enough doctors. Most of the South African doctors are very junior, few senior South African doctors are willing to work in the public health service and the service is very dependent on individuals like us who are prepared to live and work here.

The structure of health care is broadly similar to the NHS. A patient normally consults their GP or local clinic initially, but in an emergency goes straight to the hospital casualty department. The GPs work only in the towns and are all private and of very variable quality; there is no mandatory training for doctors wishing to enter general practice. The Health Clinics are government run and free but only able to offer a very basic service. Patients with more complex needs are referred to the Family Medicine department which provides most of the services for which you would consult your GP in the UK as well as care for HIV/AIDS and TB. Patients referred to the hospital pay a one-off fee of between 20 and 65 Rand (£1.50 - £5.00) depending on their ability to pay. A small fee for those in work but a very significant charge if your weekly pension is only just over 100 Rand. Emergency care is free but if your problem is considered non-urgent you will be referred to be seen in Family Medicine the following day.

There are no appointment times for hospital clinics, patients turn up and wait to be seen. At 7.30am there are usually 20 to 30 patients waiting for Family Medicine, by midday there are often 50 - 60 patients crowded into the department. With no air conditioning in the waiting area and the temperature last week in the high 30s the waiting can be an ordeal,

especially if you are unwell, but patients rarely complain. Patients who arrive after 1pm are sent to casualty where those with urgent problems will be seen, the rest will have to wait until the following day, many patients choose to sleep overnight in the waiting areas. Clinics should finish by 4pm but Sherwood rarely leaves much before 5pm.

Sadly, the majority of the very unwell are relatively young patients with HIV/AIDS and TB in their 30s and 40s. The older patients suffer from the usual conditions familiar to GPs in the NHS but are generally healthier than their children. A distressing scenario that Sherwood sees every day is an older parent accompanying their seriously ill adult children in the clinic, often having already lost several other children to the disease. It is difficult to exaggerate the impact of this disease on the community. In KwaZulu Natal 30 – 40% of young people are HIV positive and, although the disease can now be managed, there is no cure. These individuals face a shortened and unproductive life, at huge cost to the health service and the wider economy.

Despite all these problems, we are glad we came here; the work is challenging but immensely rewarding. The patients we manage are often wonderful characters, especially the older generation and highly appreciative of the care we can offer. We feel we are making a real contribution to the health care of a deprived community. Personal security is a concern but neither of us has felt seriously threatened and we have enjoyed exploring the local area with its many tourist destinations.

However 12 months will be more than enough and we are already looking forward to returning to our home in Nunton.
