Celebrations at the Radnor Hall

Guests of all ages joined the Radnor Hall committee for a convivial evening last Thursday to celebrate the completion of an extension to the main building comprising additional storage rooms and disabled facilities, and the refurbishment of other areas. Local residents and others from neighbouring villages, builders, councillors and representatives of funding organisations were present as Robert Key MP spoke of the importance to local communities of well equipped village halls and declared the extension officially open.

Hall committee chairman, Harry Joynt, expressed confidence that the new and upgraded facilities, together with extra car parking and an eagerly awaited outside play area, will increase the attraction of the hall to a wide variety of users, notably for junior play groups, children's parties, receptions and amateur dramatics.

The improvements, at a total cost of some £50,000, have been funded by the Big Lottery Reaching Communities Fund, Landfill Communities Fund and Wiltshire County and Districts Village Hall Grants Scheme. Cleansing Services Group distributes the Landfill Committee Fund through Community First.
