### Press release re Stonehenge

### Application to upgrade visitor facilities

Wiltshire Council has received a planning application to upgrade the visitor facilities at Stonehenge. The planning application was formally registered on Tuesday, 13<sup>th</sup> October by Wiltshire Council.

The proposals for the World Heritage site will create a £25 million visitor centre at Airman's Corner with new exhibition and education facilities. Proposed changes include closing and grassing over a section of the A344 that runs close to the stones and removal of the existing car park and much of the existing visitor centre.

A transit system taking people from the visitor centre to the stones site is also proposed along with upgrading the Airman's Corner junction to a roundabout.

It is proposed to relocate the existing Airman's Cross monument to a new location at Airman's Corner.

The planning application (Ref:

S/2009/1527FULL), listed building application (Ref: S/2009/1528/LBC) and accompanying environmental statement can be viewed online at the Council's Website at

<u>www.wiltshire.gov.uk</u>. They are also available to view at the Planning Office at 61 Wyndham Road, Salisbury during office hours and at Salisbury and Amesbury libraries during opening hours.

The Council is seeking comments on the plans from anyone interested in this application. The deadline for comments is  $12^{th}$  November 2009.




