A message from John Jones (acting Headteacher, Odstock Primary School)

I would like to thank the Editor for giving me the opportunity to introduce myself to you as the acting Headteacher at Odstock Primary School. I have previously been working as a class teacher at Greentrees Primary School in Salisbury. Having gained my qualification as a Headteacher, it is rewarding to be able to lead this school at an exciting time.

It has been a wonderful start to the new year at Odstock Primary School. I have felt a warm welcome from the children, parents, staff and governors, which I thank you all for! I have since had the opportunity to join and discover for myself what a lovely community there is in these villages.

I am delighted to find that I have come to a school which is so enthusiastic for learning and feels a strong commitment to the environment.

It was a great pleasure to find out that nineteen of our pupils have won a Young Writer's competition to become published authors in a book called, 'The Adventure Starts Here—Tales From South West England.' Each child wrote a mini-saga, filled with mystery, excitement and adventure. The book is published on 30th November this year.

Thank you to everyone in the community who donated your old copies of Yellow Pages to our school. The children were proud to send off 139 copies for recycling, as an entry in the 'yellow woods recycling challenge.' Odstock Primary School came second in the whole of South Wiltshire, which is a real achievement for a village school.

Wiltshire Wildlife Trust visited the school last week to present a certificate to the School Council, along with a £200 grant to spend on improving the environment in the school grounds. The school will also receive six beech tree saplings in the Spring to plant out, so the village will see the benefits of this award for many years to come.

I cannot end without reflecting on the good work that Melanie Sweeney has done at this school and wishing her success in her new one.

Doreen Osmond has again produced a varied and interesting programme for the year 2008/2009 with some wonderful help from Jill Dodd and Sheila May.

When the business meeting was over we had a coffee break and the opportunity to visit the raffle, once again set up by Jeane O'Rourke, which made the remarkable sum of £103.

Sue Bourne won the flower of the month with a white rose.

We were then treated, (and indeed it was a treat) to a talk on The Women's Land Army given by Jeane Keane. She dressed as a land girl, and being an actress we heard every word and facts and humour were delivered in equal measure. From small beginnings in 1917, she took us through to 23,000 members in 1918 (leading indirectly to votes for women in 1928). Then, particularly relevant to us, was its reforming in 1939 under the leadership of Lady Denman (of Denman College fame). The trials and tribulations of these young women, one third of whom had always lived in towns, were described, with the primitive conditions, negligible pay and extreme loneliness until hostels were introduced in 1944. The land Army soon became a serious force with many girls specialising as mechanics, thatchers and Lumber Jills. One thousand of them became fully trained rat catchers. Their social life was helped along first by the British Army and then by the Americans. Many a GI bride was whisked off to The United States.

Forty of us stayed on for a delicious lunch produced by members and master-minded, yet again, by Margaret Barrow. It was altogether a thoroughly good occasion.

Just in case you might be interested, I am writing to tell you about two unusual and highly recommended events to take place in Salisbury Cathedral Close in mid-October.

Building Bridges

The famous bridge of Mostar, in Bosnia-Herzegovina, so badly damaged during the 1990's war, was built as a link for the people from one side of Mostar to the other. People came from far and wide to visit this wonder of the world.

On 9th October at 7.30pm in the Medieval Hall there will be a presentation by Ruth Waterman. wonderful violinist and daughter of Fanny Waterman who founded the Leeds Piano Competition, who has been working in Mostar newly coaching the emerging Sinfonietta. She has recorded her work, her adventures, the mixed identity of the members of the orchestra and the players' experiences during and after the war. She will be in discussion on this evening with Richard Chew, composer who is flying over from Australia for these two events, and Howard Moody, conductor of the Sarum Orchestra. Tickets will be £12 each (to include a glass of wine and canapes) and may be obtained from the Festival Office, 87 Crane Street - open Mon-Fri 10.00am - 5.00pm - Phone 01722 332241.

Following on from this evening, on Saturday 11th October at 7.30pm in the Cathedral, Sarum Orchestra will be performing Beethoven's Violin Concerto, followed by Stari Most. This is an oratorio composed by Richard Chew, to be performed by Sarum Orchestra with Salisbury Cathedral Junior Choir and Amery Hill School Choir. 
